Finding the ultimate retreat in Crete

Stressed out? If need of some serious R&R? In tone with Greece, in line with the roots of Crete's culture, no better place to go and head yourself off to than Achlada. A hidden gem, a veritable oasis of nature, wonderful food and a chance to socialise with a handful of like-minded people from around the world, the United States, Britain and Bulgaria, to mention a few.

The Mourtzanakis Residence in Achlada is a place where time seems to stand still.

Sitting at one of the tables on the terrace overlooking the olive groves, you can feel the vibration of Achlada and Peppi, with the sun going down over the sea glittering in the distance. The sun is setting over the owners, restaurateurs, behind wings by a glass of his world-famous wine, "All the best you can have."

He says, "I need time for family and friends. One day we will sit together and myself and we were sitting at this same seat, talking ourselves what we were going to do and what we wanted to do. We had a lot of olive trees, sheep, goats and not much else. It seemed more like a burden than a benefit."

That was 10 years ago. And it was then that gave them the idea to create something unique, "a place which would become a spiritual place for people who travel the world" and at the same time help to preserve a great environment and keep the ecological balance while letting their beloved island such a great place.

Born and raised in Berlin, living first in Austria and Germany, he worked in professions which had nothing to do with hotels or resorts, and with family members spread all over the planet, he and his wife, Inka, and their young wife, Europa, (also known as Genie), were no strangers to the concept of "international". Huge amounts of money were saved, only local

designers and architects were commissioned and materials, from the island were used to create the beautiful seafront Mourtzanakis Residence. The two houses are set around the main building. Each one is distinctly designed in a traditional yet easy style. The ground floor is spacious, with a large kitchen, dining room and open-plan living area, reached by a wooden staircase. The bedrooms and bathrooms, with rustic furniture, are built into the hillside, away from the Kouta of modern life, the buildings are replete with TVs, WiFi and WIF.

The two houses are built around a central building with a large communal dining room where breakfast is served, prepared by the charming Spiros. Guest facilities also include a guest house, swimming pool, a small shop to lay

the table and conservation immediately adjacent to it.

On arrival, there is a welcome drink and a bottle of wine, followed by a welcome gift.

There is a well-stocked library where you can sit in peace and relax and watch TV. Guests can also sit in the sun and read a book or have a great anniversary glass unopened. In the evenings, Marcus and Spiros will lay on a barbecue and a delicious meal, followed by a glass of wine in residence, assemblies on the terrace around the barbecue, helping himself to salads, meats and various cheeses.

Communication flows freely in all west three different languages at any given time and after a few days you can speak your own language in Greek, Italian or any other.

Language you didn't know a word of a few hours earlier. Any subject imaginable is discussed and exchanged.

As Marcus believes, several friendships have been struck up at the Mourtzanakis Residence which last far beyond the holiday.
